One Full Academic Year Graduate In-State Tuition Remission Fellowship with \$18,000 stipend

The Asian Studies Center (ASC) invites applications for the Chinese Language Social Media intern. Applicants must be a **currently enrolled Asian Studies certificate student of outstanding ability** (QPA of 3.0 or above) for a tuition remission fellowship in the amount of a full term in-state tuition for the 2018-2019 academic year.

The recipient of the fellowship will be required to work ten hours per week during the fall and spring terms. He/she will assist the ASC Associate Director and staff in the development and oversight of China-related social media and communications.

DUTIES

- 1. Develop and maintain of China-related social media
- 2. Frequent and coordinated posting on Chinese-language social media (Weibo, Facebook and WeChat)
- 3. Assist in the coordination and logistics of the Pitt to You program
- 4. Assist in logistical support of all ASC China-related guests
- 5. Grant development, statistics research, and support
- 6. Coordinate alumni retention efforts in Hong Kong, Taiwan, and People's Republic of China
- 7. Translation of documents from Mandarin to English and English to Mandarin as requested
- 8. Other duties as assigned

PRIMARY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Fluency in English and Mandarin Chinese
- 2. Strong computer skills, especially in Microsoft Office programs
- 3. Ability to maintain and produce content for social media (Weibo, Facebook and WeChat)
- 4. Strong writing and communication skills
- 5. Ability to be self-reliant and resourceful

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Good organizational skills and an ability to prioritize tasks
- 2. Ability to work under pressure
- 3. Ability to work in a team-oriented environment

BENEFITS

The Chinese Language Social Media Intern will receive tuition remission in the amount of one term's in-state tuition for the 2018-2019 academic year. The award can be applied to the fall OR spring terms. S/he will have the opportunity to network with Pitt alumni and students and develop their professional communication skills.
