One Academic Year Graduate In-State Tuition Remission Fellowship

The Asian Studies Center (ASC) invites applications for the Community Engagement Intern. Applicants must be a **currently enrolled Asian Studies certificate graduate student of outstanding ability** (QPA of 3.0 or above) for a tuition remission fellowship in the amount of two terms in-state tuition for the 2018-2019 academic year.

The recipient of the fellowship will be required to work up to 19 hours per week during the fall and spring terms. S/he will be responsible for cultivating and establishing strategic connections with community members and organizations.

#### **DUTIES**

- 1. Identify community interests and potential partners
- 2. Oversee outreach to community and student organizations
- 3. Develop programs to engage community
- 4. Attend and represent ASC at community events
- 5. Establish and maintain regular communication to keep them updated and informed of Pitt events.
- 6. Coordinate the daily tasks of the ASC student interns
- 7. Keep ASC calendar updated including the tracking of attendance
- 8. Other duties as assigned

#### PRIMARY REQUIREMENTS

- 9. Ability to work independently yet collaboratively in a team-oriented environment
- 10. Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- 11. Ability to interact professionally and with cultural sensitivity with community leaders and organizations.
- 12. Must be able to develop and maintain relationships with a diverse group of community members and have a clear understanding of both Center priorities and the complex dynamics between different groups.
- 13. Ability to be self-reliant and resourceful

#### PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Experience as a community liaison
- 2. Ability to work under pressure
- 3. Experience evaluating and coordinating the impact of community programs.
