Study abroad in Prague, Czech Republic and Krakow, Poland and receive 3 Pitt credits!

- Participants enroll in Department of History course, *Czech Republic and Poland: Impact of the European Union and Globalization*, offered in Summer 2010.
- Potential participants must contact the course instructor, **Dr. Bob Donnorummo** (History), for permission to enroll (tsarpepe@pitt.edu).
- Credits count toward certificate programs in Russian and East European Studies (REES) or European Union Studies.
- Open to all qualified Pitt undergraduate students.
- Local arrangements in Prague and Krakow provided by the Dartmore Institute for Central European Studies (<http://dartmore.cz/content/mission.html>).

This program will focus on contemporary issues in the Czech Republic and Poland. Students will attend guest lectures by academic, political, and economic leaders in Prague and Krakow; field trips; and daily lectures by Dr. Donnorummo.

Program fee (TBA) will include:

- tuition and fees for three credits,
- accommodations in double rooms,
- medical insurance,
- daily breakfasts,
- three group dinners,
- all field trips,
- cultural events,
- airport transfers,
- train from Prague to Krakow, and
- local transportation passes.

Students must budget for airfare, meals not covered by the program fee, course materials, personal expenses, and the Pitt study abroad fee. **There is no visa requirement for short-term travel to the Czech Republic and Poland.**
