**Architecture & the City in Central Europe: 19th and 20th Centuries**  
History of Art and Architecture Study Abroad Course

**May 8-25, 2010**

This Integrated Field Trip Abroad (IFTA) is designed for students who have enrolled in Dr. Drew Armstrong's History of Art and Architecture courses, "Architecture: Texts + Theory" and/or "Modern Architecture," and other interested students with permission from Dr. Armstrong ([cda68@pitt.edu](mailto:cda68@pitt.edu)).

The IFTA will explore the process of modernization and how it affected urban form, architectural expression, and architectural theory and pedagogy. Students will investigate the modernization of three important Central European cities and the impact of new ideas about design, technology, and social organization on the development of new building types and urban infrastructure in the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

Students will be based for the first 6 days in Vienna, Austria and then for 10 days in Zagreb, Croatia. They will participate in daily visits to sites in and around these cities and a day trip to Ljubljana, Slovenia. The site visits will be led by Professor Armstrong, who is a specialist in the architectural history of Europe.

*Program fee of \$1,790\* will include:*

- tuition and fees for three Pitt credits,
- accommodations in double rooms,
- course materials,
- medical insurance,
- daily breakfasts,
- all field trips,
- cultural events,
- airport transfers,
- train from Vienna to Zagreb, and
- local transportation passes.

Students must budget for airfare, meals not covered by the program fee, personal expenses, and the Pitt study abroad fee. **There is no visa requirement for short-term travel to Croatia and Austria.**
