Course/Module Narrative:	This module focuses the distribution of authority among states, supranational organizations and sub-national levels of government. Students will use a case study on the European Union (EU) to gain a basic understanding of the arrangements that may exist among government entities and how different political groups and electoral systems may influence the function/effectiveness of those arrangements.
