PASSPORT and PROOF OF VACCINATION

Keep your passport and your vaccine card with you during the daytime for all site visits. They are required for security at all site visits and you will be denied access without them.

Please make two copies of the front page (with your photo and passport number) of your passport and take photos of your vaccine card on your phone. Leave one copy/photo with a family member or friend at home and take the other with your belongings for the trip, but keep it in a separate location from the original.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Belgium is a party to the Schengen Agreement. As a U.S. citizen, you can enter the Schengen area for up to 90 days for tourist or business purposes without a visa. **A passport valid for** <u>at least three months</u> **beyond your date of departure from Belgium (or another Schengen country) is required for entry.**

TRANSPORTATION AND ARRIVAL INFORMATION

The program will begin on the evening of the first Sunday of your tour dates at 6:00 pm in one of the conference rooms located in the Martin's Brussels EU Hotel (see address above).

To get to Martin's Brussels EU Hotel from the airport, take the Airport Line Bus (bus 12) to Place Schuman, approximately 30 minutes at the cost of €7.00. Tickets are available from the GO Vending machine located on bus station Platform C, or once you board the bus (with an additional fee). The bus station is located on level 0, one floor down from airport arrivals. You will need to purchase a "Go2City" ticket if you use the GO vending machine.

After you get off at Place Schuman, the hotel is a short 3-minute walking distance. Head north on Rue Archimede toward Rue Stevin. Turn left on Rue Stevin. At the roundabout, take the second exit onto Boulevard Charlemagne. The hotel will be on your left.

Taxis are also available. It will cost approximately 40-60 euros to travel from the airport to the hotel.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Public transportation will be used frequently throughout the course of the tour. Upon arrival participants should purchase a multi-trip metro/tram/bus card. A 10-journey "BRUPASS" ticket costs approximately €21.00 (€15.60 for the journeys and €5 for the MOBIB card) and can be purchased at kiosks in most metro stops. You will need a debit or credit card with a pin number to purchase the ticket. See the STIB (Brussels Public Transit) website for more information, paying particular attention to the Fares page. The standard BRUPASS ticket is all that is needed for our itinerary; you can optionally purchase the BRUPASS XL 10-journey ticket for €21 (+ €5 card fee) if you would like to travel farther from the city center.

HOTEL SERVICES

- Free wireless internet is available at the hotel.
- Guests have free access to the fitness center and sauna.
- Your reservation includes a free complimentary breakfast.
- A blue velvet gorilla will greet you at the hotel (trust us, this will all make sense later).

WEATHER

The average temperatures in Brussels, Belgium, in June are in the mid- to high-60s and fall to around 50°F in the evenings. But that's an average, and fluctuations are possible. Brussels typically gets around 11 days of rainfall in June so make sure to pack raingear (including appropriate footwear) for the tour.

MEALS

The hotel breakfast is included with your room and has many options. In addition, the European Studies Center at the University of Pittsburgh will host one group meal during the tour. Otherwise, you are responsible for all other meals and incidentals.

MONEY

Belgium's currency is the euro (€). You can exchange currency at the airport (prior to your departure in the US or upon arrival in Europe), at most train stations, and at banks in larger cities. You can also withdraw money using a US bank card at ATMs (fees may apply). Many small restaurants do not accept credit cards. Those places that do accept credit cards often require a "chip" ("puce" in French) with an associated PIN. If you do not have a credit card with a chip, please contact your bank to see if they have the technology available to issue you a new card prior to the trip. Additionally, please inquire about requesting a PIN for your chip (many businesses in the US do not require one, but European businesses do).

If you are in a pinch, most businesses are still able to swipe your debit or credit card. The strip is referred to as "piste" in French in the event that you need help explaining this to someone.

Please contact your bank and/or credit card company to alert them that you will be traveling. Have ready your exact dates of travel. Failure to do so may cause the bank to put a hold on your account.

<u>Important note</u>: Please make sure to keep documentation of your expenses during the trip – boarding passes, receipts, etc. Each university sponsoring your participation in the Brussels Study Tour may manage your travel grant differently so please retain all of your receipts, as they may be needed for reimbursements upon your return.

ATTIRE

Business casual dress is required for all site visits. Please make sure to pack comfortable shoes as the group will use public transportation or walk to all site visit locations.

ADAPTER

Outlets in Belgium use a Type E plug and are not compatible with traditional US two prong (Type A) or three prong (Type B) plugs. Please purchase an international universal adapter to charge your phone or for the use of other electronics while staying in Brussels.

LUXEMBOURG DAY TRIP (subject to cancellation)

The plan is to visit the European Court of Justice, as long as such a visit is allowed. If it is, we will be leaving Belgium for a day and entering Luxembourg. The relevant information about travel restrictions in Luxembourg can be found here:

As of 2/25/22, no additional steps are required beyond those for Belgium, and arriving by train in the country should not be difficult. The QR code received in Belgium for the Covid Safe Ticket should also be valid in Luxembourg stores and restaurants, though this may change, and our travel plans will be subject to confirming that we will be able to move relatively freely through the city.

RETURNING TO THE U.S.:

While testing is not currently required to enter Belgium or travel to Luxembourg, it *is* required to return to the United States (as of 2/25/2022).

Testing in Belgium:

Covid PCR and/or antigen tests are available, reliably so within one calendar day. See https://www.info-coronavirus.be/en/testing/ for locations of testing centers. The Brussels Airport offers COVID-19 testing for both arriving and departing passengers, though this is the most expensive option. Details will be provided closer to the trip, as locations, prices, and requirements are subject to change. We will be facilitating appointments to ensure everyone can comply with whatever regulations are in place at the time. Arrangements/appointments will be made on-site and communicated to each participant.
