

North Allegheny Places Second in National Euro Challenge Competition!

As previously reported, five students from North Allegheny Intermediate High School were awarded a trip to New York City this past spring to compete in the semi-final and final rounds of the nationwide Euro Challenge, an economic-based competition for 9th and 10th grade high school students. After winning their semi-final, North Allegheny turned in another strong performance and placed second in the national competition.
