She often leaves her parents at a loss by asking about mature or complex topics. As an example, she gets chided for not concerning herself with childlike things but asking, instead, about China's communism; in response, she pretends to play with bubbles in soapy water only to promptly proclaim that she is done and then restate the China question once more. Her incisive observations often leave the adults at a loss. Mafalda is very popular in Latin America, Europe, and Asia, leading to two animated cartoon series and a book. After Mafalda, we will share another short movie, which will be a very nice surprise for the audience. Open to children of all ages and to those who are children at heart!! 
