Dr. Éva Lovra holds a Ph.D. in Architectural Sciences and has conducted postdoctoral research at the

Bartlett School of Architecture, University College London, and at the University of Novi Sad. She is a senior lecturer/adjunct professor at the University of Debrecen's Department of Civil Engineering, teaches in the English-language Urban Systems Engineering M.Sc. program, and serves as a lecturer and doctoral supervisor at the Doctoral School of Earth Sciences.

Are you interested in architecture and urbanism or the age of empires and totalitarian regimes? Would you like to travel through Central European cities and their East European counterparts and understand them better?

In this course, you will discover Central European architecture and urban structure from the period of the late Gothic flourish forms to the era of the Socialist Red Star to understand the legacy of empires and totalitarian regimes on the built environment. You will learn about key landmarks, urban morphology, and the urban heritage of Central European towns. You will also have the opportunity to explore how Central European urban and architectural history fits within the broader history of urban planning in Europe from the late Gothic to the post-WWII period.
