To get to the EuroFlat Hotel from the airport, take the airport line bus to Place Schuman, approximately 30 minutes at a cost of €4.00 one way if ticket is purchased outside of the bus and €6 if ticket is purchased inside bus. Tickets available from GO Vending machine, located on bus station platform C. Bus station is located on level 0, one floor down from airport arrivals hall.




