Staging the Compelling Question:

In staging the compelling question, "Should Turkey be required to recognize the Armenian Genocide as a precondition to joining the European Union?", teachers can have <u>students read about the European Union</u> and watch a <u>brief video discussing what The European Union does.</u>

Supporting Question 1:

The first supporting question, "What are the requirements for joining the European Union," encourages students to examine two sources which will help them understand the requirements for joining The European Union. The formative assessment task has students use symbols or illustrations to show the different requirements for joining The European Union.

Supporting Question 2:

The second supporting question, "What was the Armenian Genocide?" has students examine witness testimony, a website, and video to help them understand what genocide is and specifically the events leading up to The Armenian Genocide, and what happened during the Armenian Genocide. The performance tasks asks students to create a timeline of events connected to The Armenian Genocide.

Supporting Question 3:

Supporting question 3, "Why hasn't Turkey recognized The Armenian Genocide?" has students analyze various sources to compile a list of reasons why Turkey has not recognized as what happened in Armenia between 1915-1923 as genocide.

Summative Performance Task:

The summative performance task has students put together everything they learned from the three supporting questions to answer the compelling question using evidence from the sources they read, discussed, and watched. Students should be able to demonstrate the breadth of their understanding and their ability to use evidence from multiple sources to support their claims. Construct an argument (e.g., detailed outline, poster, editorial, essay, or your own idea) that discusses the compelling question using specific claims and relevant evidence from the sources provided, while acknowledging competing views.
