Week 2 Hour 1	→ Students will continue to explore the underlying elements of what contributes to peace, utilizing group activity on page 171 of the EU Youth Transforming Conflict Toolkit
Week 2 Hour 2	→ Students will continue to work on their group projects
Week 3	→ Students will present group projects, will have time beforehand for any further preparations
