Nuala Mole is a human rights lawyer and advocate who founded a legal advice and advocacy organization called the AIRE Centre in 1993. Her work now includes all aspects of international human rights law including the areas of

immigration and asylum. Previously, she served as director of a nongovernmental organization (NGO) called Interights. In addition, Mole has conducted training for the Council of Europe, the European Commission, and the AIRE Centre for judges, public officials, lawyers, and NGOs in 40 of the 47 member states of the Council of Europe.
