How does psychological knowledge intersect with power and capital? Can disorders be explained via a clear biological marker, or are they the result of particular ways of seeing (or being seen)? What difference does that distinction make to people who provide mental healthcare, and those living under the description of disorder? This lecture course explores these topics from an anthropological perspective. Through engaging with studies from around the world, students will gain not only an appreciation of the rich diversity of human experience, but also a critical understanding of how our feelings and senses of wellbeing are structured by forces beyond ourselves. Who am I? What do I feel? How might I feel more normal? What is „normal“? As the authors explored in this course demonstrate, these questions are as much personal as political and cultural.

In this course, we will examine bioethical issues that arise in contemporary medical research and practice through a philosophical lens. We will analyze bioethical dilemmas around a range of issues including moral relativism, ethical codes, informed consent and medical decision-making, race in medicine, pandemics, and the global distribution of medical resources. Students will develop reasoning strategies to support particular decisions and analyze disagreements by identifying the facts, values, concepts and logic that are assumed. This course is part of a core sequence leading to certification in the Conceptual Foundations of Medicine Certificate Program and is a companion course to HPS 0612 (Mind and Medicine) but may be taken independently.
