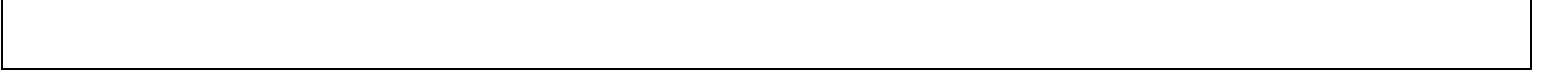

<p>This course focuses on the Black Death of the 14th century, the world's worst most lethal pandemic in terms of population percentage lost. Recent scientific research has fundamentally changed the way that historians are able to study the global history of the bacterium Yersinia pestis, which is still endemic today in four continents, but many questions remain unanswered, including why the Black Death was so calamitous. Like other pandemics, the Black Death was a biological phenomenon, but it was also a cultural, social, religious, and political phenomenon. This course introduces the interpretation of a wide range of sources, from many regions and disciplines, to illuminate the pandemic.</p>
