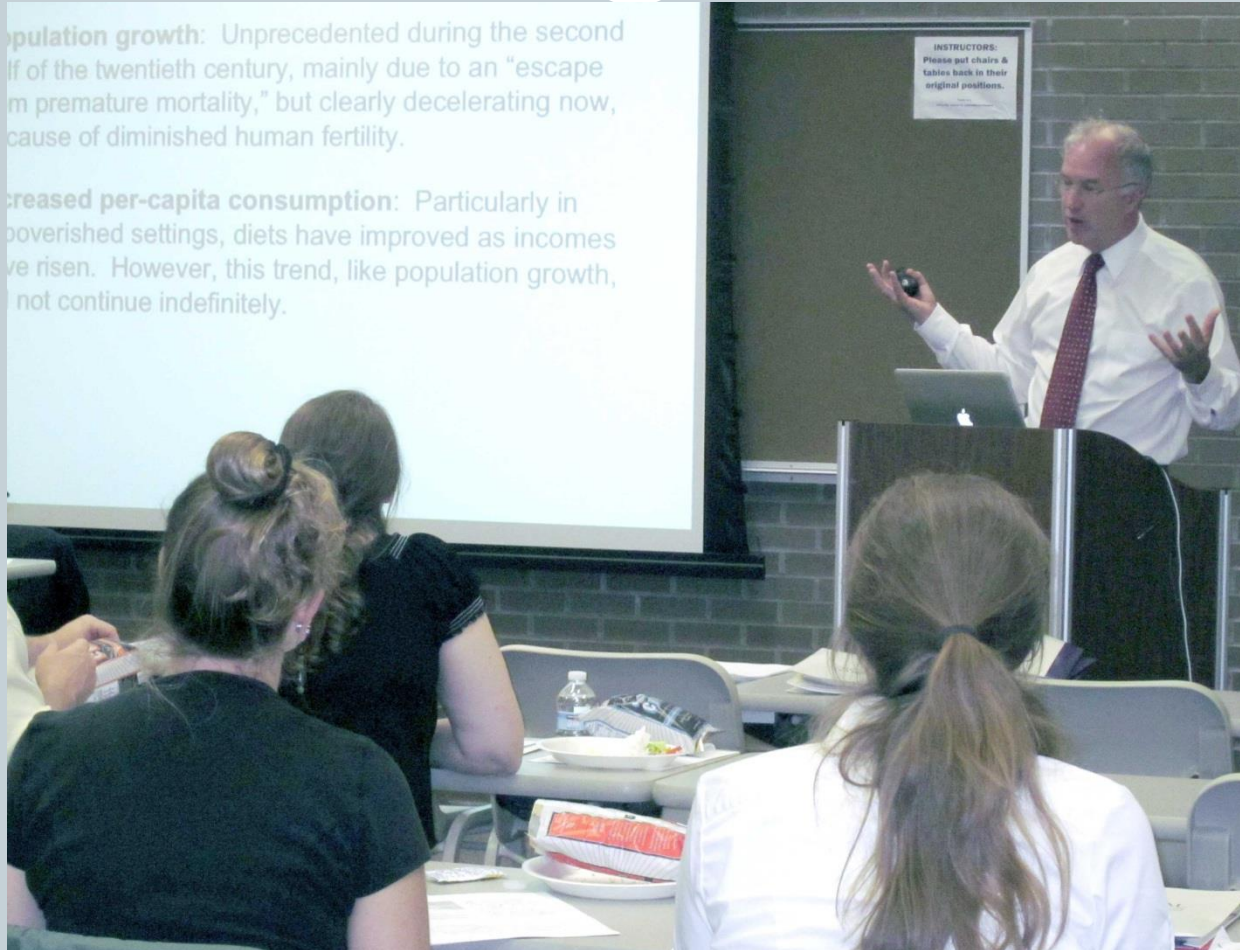

Increased per-capita consumption: Particularly in impoverished settings, diets have improved as incomes have risen. However, this trend, like population growth, will not continue indefinitely.
