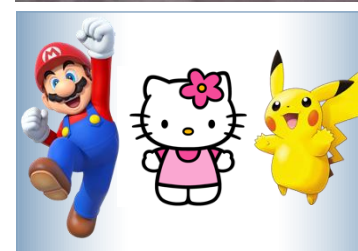
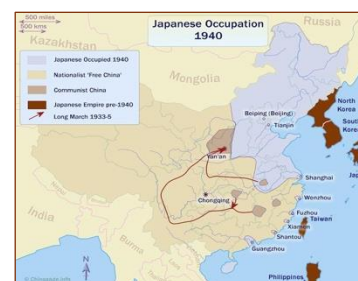
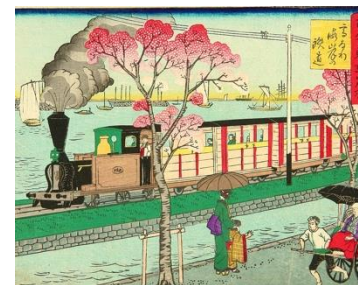


Teaching Modern East Asia
