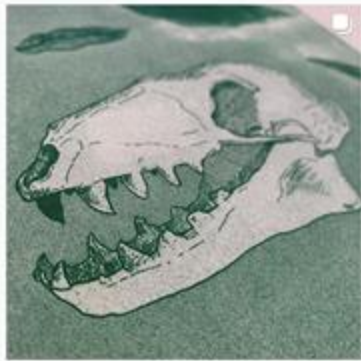

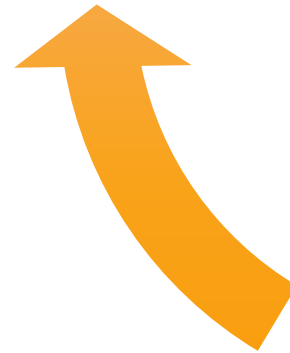

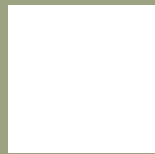
ZINE REQUIREMENTS



Each student will complete at least one A4 (or 8.5 x 11 inch) size piece of paper to be scanned and emailed back to us.



One student (or group of students) will create a title/cover and a back cover which illustrates (without words) your school/class.



Each zine page should then be scanned and emailed to us (or mail them to us if you prefer), and we will produce a finished professionally printed zine of 12 pages (or additional multiples of 4).
